Rorie Measure shares this information with us -An Interesting Play Coming Up at the Black Box Theater:

Photograph 51 is the title of an upcoming play at the Black Box Theater, located at 430 N. Main in the Downtown Mall. Written by Anna Ziegler, and presented by No Strings Theatre Company, the show is directed by Artistic Director, Ceil Herman. It tells the story of **Rosalind Franklin** and her significant contributions to the understanding of DNA. Her achievements were largely unrecognized in her lifetime.

A review from the *Seattle Times* describes the play: "In Ziegler's taut yet graceful script... Franklin's passion for science...shines through, as does the agility of her inquiring mind. "Photograph 51" neatly coils a scientific detective story around a rumination on how sexism, personality, and morality can inpact collaboration and creativity. It honors Franklin by painting her as a complete person... and by evoking the thrills and risks of scientific pursuit itself."


