Please consider attending the upcoming AAUW-NM state convention in Carlsbad, April 20-22, with the theme "Back to the Future: Connecting Our Past to Our Future." In addition to very informative sessions, the organizers have planned many fun events, such as a river boat ride, art activities, and a banquet at the Living Desert Zoo and Gardens. Current Issues before the New Mexico Legislature and Their Impact on AAUW's National Mission

If you have clicked on the link found at the bottom of the Co-Presidents' letter above, this is a new OMV column that will interest you. Suggested by Co-President Beverly Chambers, this is a place where you can look to see what action has passed or is pending in the New Mexico Legislature pertinent to the Mission of AAUW National.

This month features a commentary by Beverly Chambers regarding recent action of the NM State Legislature. It begins:

"We (the AAUW Lobby Corp) applaud the New Mexico house of Representatives for sending bipartisan budget bill (House Bill 2) to the Senate with increased support for New Mexico public school students. The increase does not make up for decades of short-changing our students, but it is a positive move toward a more prosperous New Mexico."

# Historic Monument to Women Veterans Officially Dedicated




The City of Las Cruces and the United Military Women of the SouthWest (UMWSW) will officially dedicate the Women Veterans Monument at 10 a.m. Saturday, March 10, at Veterans Memorial Park, 2651 Roadrunner Parkway, Las Cruces.

The historic monument, one of only a few such tributes honoring military women of the United States Armed Forces, features six lifesize bronze statues representing Army, Marine, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard and Army National Guard women in detailed uniforms from World War I, World War II, Korea, Vietnam, Cold War and current eras. Among the special guests expected to attend include Captain Betty Somppi, a centenarian who served as an original member of the first Women Auxiliary Army Corp (WAAC) from 1942-1945.

In collaboration with the UMWSW, The City of Las Cruces Museums has created a temporary photo exhibit of local women veterans which can be seen at the monument during the dedication. In addition, Thomas Branigan Memorial Library will feature a special section dedicated to women veterans in its month-long Women's History Month display.
