On Saturday, November 10, a *Prevention Educator* from La Pinon Children's Advocacy Center will discuss the various services offered. Their mission is to provide comprehensive services related to sexual violence and child abuse to individuals, families and the community. They offer a 24-hour victim crisis line, outpatient counseling, community education, professional training, and *Kid Talk* - a warm talk-line for children 17 and under.

La Piñon believes that by offering unconditional support, information and a safe environment for change, the person who has been sexually assaulted can take steps to regain control of their life and make the transition from victim to survivor.

La Piñon began delivering services in July 1992.

From our President: Christa Slaton

I am pleased to announce that **MaryIn Zahler** has agreed to serve as our branch's fundraising chair for 2018-19. Our fundraising goal for this year is \$5,000 and MaryIn is seeking AAUW-LC members to serve on a committee with her to determine and implement strategies to meet our goal. At our October meeting MaryIn was recognized for her 50 years of membership in AAUW. We are blessed to have such a dedicated member of our branch.

At our most recent Board meeting, we approved a proposal to allocate \$700 of our budget to national AAUW projects. \$300 will go to the Legal Advocacy Fund to support legal action taken on behalf of promoting equity for women and girls. \$200 was allocated to the International Development Fund to bring international students to our country to study. An additional \$200 was designated for International Project Grants. It is a tribute to the generosity of our members that we not only support our local residents, but that our reach is also national and international.

At our last spring meeting this year we approved a revision to our **bylaws**. At the time, we had not received feedback from the state's compliance officers to assure that our terminology was consistent with the recent changes at state and national level. This summer we received that input and thanks very much to **Judy McGuire** those changes have been incorporated and approved by the Board. Three of our members were honored at the Girl Scouts' "Women of Distinction" luncheon in September – **Carol Ann Council, Rorie Measure, and Christina Little.** AAUW members and guests purchased six tables, each seating 8 people, at the luncheon!!! Our branch also set up a table with AAUW literature and membership forms at the event. Our presence was noticed as we helped honor all the awardees.

Carol Ann Council, Kathie Davis, Beverly Chambers, and I will be attending the Leadership Team Meeting in Las Vegas, NM this month. In addition to discovering what other branches are doing around the state to achieve our mission "to advance gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy," Kathie will be making a presentation on the state convention to be held in Las Cruces April 26-28, 2019. We are eager to have a great representation of our members throughout New Mexico at the convention, which will be packed with inspiring workshops and enriching interaction with members across the state.

Our branch will partner with Sierra Middle School again this year to provide a holiday market for students to choose gifts for the family members. Teachers at the school and our members donate items—new or gently used—that students select as gifts for their parents and siblings. Items that are particularly popular:

(for males) are hand tools, ball caps, T-shirts, mugs, socks, and items with team logos; (for females) potholders, mitts, towels, spoon rests, lotions and soaps; and (for young siblings) all sorts of toys games, and stuffed animals. In addition to donating items, our members volunteer time to wrap gifts that students select. It truly is an uplifting experience. Members are asked to bring gift donations to the November general meeting. Volunteer wrappers will be needed at the school. Details to follow.

It is truly exciting to belong to such an active and supportive AAUW branch and to see our membership grow at each general meeting. Thank each of you for your value to achieving our mission, *Christa*.


