Our Public Policy Chair, **Cheryl Wilson**, has joined the Doña Ana County Election Advisory Council, whose goal is to increase voter registration and participation in the 2018 elections. They are seeking volunteers to educate and engage 350 high school voters from across the city on October 9th. Tasks for volunteers include everything from tours of the County Government Building, crowd control, and general organizational tasks that day. Kathie Davis, Chair of the 2019 state convention, reminded us that 2019 is the centennial anniversary of Congressional passage of the 19th Amendment to guarantee women's suffrage. Although the amendment was not ratified until 1920, we will begin a year-long centennial celebration of that important step towards advancing "gender equity for women and girls through research, education, and advocacy". As we approach the 2018 mid-term elections, we need to appreciate that women now vote in higher percentages than men and we play key roles advancing democracy. A special feature of the state convention to be held April 26-28, 2019 in Las Cruces is the showing of the film *Iron Jawed Angels*. It will remind us to remember those who struggled for gender equity more than 100 years ago and the price they personally paid to help our lives be better. It is an inspiring film to motivate us when we continue to fight for pay equity and equal opportunity for girls and women.


