Girls Can! celebrated its 25th anniversary in March with the largest participation in its history: 250 6th grade girls attended; more than 50 parents attended workshops; and 190 volunteers devoted time and talent. The fundraising goals for the program were surpassed, resulting in more than \$3,000 available towards the 2020 event. Much gratitude extended to **Kay Brilliant, Londa Seiffert**, and **Kay Williams** for leading this annual effort.

Our branch's support of Tech Trek also broke records. We had 14 nominations from our county this year compared to only seven last year. Four girls have been selected from Las Cruces schools, following reviewing the essays and conducting interviews. Huge thanks to **Judy McGuire** for leading the nomination efforts and recruiting so many of our members to contact each of our schools this year. In addition, your individual donations to Tech Trek have exceeded 2018 to date.

Laura Bemis led an Equal Pay Task Force to develop action plans for our branch. Other members were Shirley Armstrong, Anne Hubbell, Cheryl Wilson, Julia Bruner, Kay Brilliant, and Londa Seiffert. Our branch promoted the campaign to wear red on April 2, Equal Pay Day and members showed up in red at the Dona Ana County Commission's meeting on March 28th to hear their Proclamation supporting Equal Pay Day. The Las Cruces City Council also issued a Proclamation on April 1st with several of our members in attendance.

Also, on **Equal Pay Day** some of our branch Board members attended a course I teach at New Mexico State University on Women and Politics. The facts for my presentation came from extensive information found on the *aauworg* website. The exchange between AAUW members and students was excellent and thought provoking.

This past year our branch awarded two scholarships to female students at New Mexico State University: Fall 2018 - \$862 and Spring 2019 - \$861. We also awarded a travel grant to a student, **Ana Garcia**, who received a scholarship to attend AAUW's *National Conference for College Women Student Leaders* in Maryland on May 29-June 1, 2019. Ana is an undergraduate student at NMSU

and member of AAUW, NMSU Affiliate. She attended our April General meeting to thank our members in person.

We are looking forward to hosting AAUW members from across the state for the AAUW-NM convention. **Kathie Davis** has been diligently working on this event for a year and has received assistance from many of our members. Our Historian, **Shirley Armstrong**, has spent many hours in the archives at the University to prepare a historical display for the convention. She gave us a little taste of some of the display at our April General meeting. It is fascinating! Kudos to the branch members who have assisted Kathie and Shirley.

At our April General Meeting **MaryIn Zahler** treated us to some memories she has from membership in AAUW over several decades. As she recounted a few of her experiences, it became clear that women have come a long way, but MaryIn reminds us forcefully that we still have a way to go to achieve equity for all. She donated \$100 to the branch when **Shirley Armstrong** was able to answer her challenge question: "What is the difference in the membership directory today compared to 50 years ago?"..... Five decades ago, the members were listed as "Mrs. John Doe." If the women were married, their personal names were not used. Thanks, Marlyn, for your inspiration and dedication to AAUW's mission!

Equal PAY!!!!

The US House of Representatives <u>passed</u> the Paycheck Fairness Act HR 7 on <u>March 27</u>.

By passing this important bill, the House of Representatives has demonstrated its commitment to the economic security of American women and their families. We know there is a pay gap for all women, at every age, in every part of the country, and in nearly every industry. The gap has closed by less than a nickel in the 21st century, and it's obvious that something needs to be done to ensure families can thrive.

Now is the time to <u>contact our N.M. Senators</u> to support **S 270.** The <u>Paycheck Fairness Act</u> would: (copy and paste below in your email to our Senators:)

- Prohibit employers from using salary history, which ensures that salaries are not based on prior pay gaps that can follow workers from job to job.
- Protect against retaliation for discussing pay with colleagues, including stopping employers from being able to fire employees for sharing information. Greater transparency about salary is key to helping identify disparities.
- Ensure equal pay for equal work, requiring employers to prove that any pay disparities that exist between men and women are a business necessity and for job-related reasons.
- Support employers and employees to achieve fair pay practices,

including providing technical assistance to employers, requiring wage data collection, and offering salary negotiation training programs to give women the tools to advocate for higher wages.

AAUW National Election vote by May 14



Vote for **Julia Brown** to serve <u>second term</u> as AAUW Board Chair: "I'm currently the AAUW National Board chair, and I believe a lot has been accomplished during my term. My voice has been a strong one. I would like the opportunity to complete several collaborative efforts to increase AAUW's visibility and sphere of influence. I believe continuity of leadership is critical to



the organization's continued growth and success. Having those who currently serve on the board and those who have served on national boards or in senior positions with other organizations would be a great benefit to AAUW, especially in the implementation of the new strategic plan and diversification and inclusion efforts."

For this vote, members are also asked to vote on amendments to the Public Policy Priorities, in addition to electing members to the national board of directors. No amendments to the AAUW bylaws have been proposed by the Governance Committee or AAUW Board of Directors for the 2019 vote. Some members think that because we are not having a "live" National Convention this summer that they don't need to vote. We NEED EACH member to vote; we need a quorum in order to do business for the annual meeting. Some also think that if a candidate does not have an opponent they don't need to vote (for example, Las Cruces branch member **Julia Brown** is up for re-election to the position of National Board Chairman without an opponent but still needs each member's vote), as noted above, we need each member to cast a vote in this election!


Your Board voted:
