On Thursday, **October 17**, we will gather for a **Lescombes Wine Tour**." The winery <u>tour</u> will begin at the <u>Las Cruces D.H. Lescombes Winery & Bistro</u> at 1720 Avenida de Mesilla, with a Mimosa greeting. There will be a quick stop in Deming to stretch and wander. While visiting our family-owned vineyard, just east of Lordsburg, enjoy the services of personable, well-informed tour guides that will take you on a journey throughout 200 acres of lush wine grape vines. Enjoy a delightful lunch and wine pairing at the Lescombes' home on the vineyard. You will have an opportunity to taste vintage wines selected from the personal, underground wine cellar of patriarch Hervé Lescombes. Later at the winery in Deming, you'll tour our operational winery and be treated to a V.I.P. "wine tasting, straight out of the barrel".

I have been on many wine tours across this country and a few others countries as well. I can honestly say this is one of the most enjoyable. They kept us hydrated, fed and informed the entire day.

Total space is <u>limited to 20-each member may bring a guest</u>. The cost is \$69 per person. In addition to the tour, transport, stops, wine, and feedings, coupons for a free wine flight, meal discount and case discount is distributed. <u>We meet in Mesilla at 8:30 and return around 5:30.</u>

It will be necessary to pay in advance (check or cash) and once the twenty have signed up, there will be no more space. As I am required to pay in advance as well, there will be no refunds, but you are free to "sell" your spot-just let me know. \$\$\$<u>Equal Pay for Women</u>\$\$\$

AAUW Applauds House Passage of the Paycheck Fairness Act and needs your help passing the Senate version.

"By passing this important bill, the House of Representatives has demonstrated its commitment to the economic security of American women and their families. We know there is a pay gap for all women, at every age, in every part of the country, and in nearly every industry. The gap has closed by less than a nickel in the 21st century, and it's obvious that something needs to be done to ensure families can thrive."

"The Equal Pay Act of 1963 was a powerful first step, but the law has been weakened over time as the workforce demography has changed. We need new tools to fight discriminatory pay practices, and we need effective incentives and assistance to help employers comply with the law. The Paycheck Fairness Act provides these tools by closing loopholes in the Equal Pay Act and putting new protections in place for the benefit of all American workers. Its passage is long overdue."

"We urge the Senate to follow the House's lead and act now to pass the Paycheck Fairness Act. We can't wait any longer for equal pay."
