This entire year we will be celebrating the centennial of the passage and ratification of the **19th Amendment** that granted women the right to vote nationwide. In August our branch joined the **2020 Suffrage Alliance**, which was convened by the League of Women Voters, and recently we created a branch **Task Force** to help plan collaborative activities for February 22, 2020 at the downtown Plaza and on April 22, 2020 celebration at the Farm and Ranch Museum. The alliance's goals are to:

- communicate the history of suffrage and constitutional amendments related to voting rights from diverse and inclusive perspectives
- · connect the history to current voting activities
- take action to empower voters (especially related to gender equity and public safety)
- promote/expand our democracy
- build leadership capacity
