
All of the True Grit Awardees are being invited to attend our June 14th luncheon so they can meet our members and we can honor them for their accomplishments!

#### **FUNDRAISING UPDATE**

As mentioned in a previous article, we are so grateful for the generosity of our members and the communities that support our work.

Total funds raised for GIRLS CAN! \$12,856.84 with total expenditures of \$11,493.11 thus providing a carry-over of \$1,363.73

Total funds raised for Scholarships (True Grit, NMSU Endowed and NCCWSL) \$ 5,663.11 with total expenditures of \$366.06, thus leaving a carry-over of \$5,297.05. \$3,000 of that carry-over is approved for distribution for True Grit Awards offered in July and August.

Two things to note: the majority of the expenditures for this scholarship category is spent after the beginning of the new fiscal year. AAUW National used to sponsor a Leadership Conference known as NCCWSL. Our local branch did not sponsor participants this year.

Total funds raised for Tech Trek were \$1,500 through the branch, with all sent to Tech Trek. Members often donate to Teck Trek directly through their website.

This report is subject to changes, as the fiscal year does not end until June 30. Please feel free to ask for more details if interested. Remember that we move 10% of all funds raised to the operations budget. With the passage of the proposed budget, we will now take 5% for operations. (The exception to this is funds raised from businesses, foundations, and external donations).

Many thanks for your very generous donations to the good work we do to move our mission forward.
