## **Public Policy**



The U.S. Department of Education (DE), established in 1979 to protect students' civil rights and centralize education assistance, has been effectively dismantled. After massive staff layoffs, its work has been shifted to other federal agencies that lack a focus on education. This change will make it harder to ensure educational effectiveness and accountability.


AAUW has issued a **strong statement** opposing this move and has joined with over **60 civil rights and education organizations** to denounce this act that threatens the rights of students, in particular those with disabilities and/or from underrepresented groups. 

#### We Remember Lori LaPlanche

News has reached us of the death of *Laurine A (Lori) LaPlanche*. We have no information about a funeral or memorial service.

For more than two decades, Lori was a devoted member of the AAUW-LC. She filled several roles, including several terms as Membership Co-Vice President and as Communications Email Chair. She also originated one of our long-standing book groups and was a regular reader and contributor.

Lori also was Co-founder of the Breast Cancer Support Group of the Community Foundation of Southern New Mexico and a supporter of the Children's Reading Alliance.

An alumna of the University of Maryland, Lori achieved her doctorate in chemistry from Michigan State University. She went on to teach Chemistry at Northern Illinois University and authored several academic articles in chemistry.
